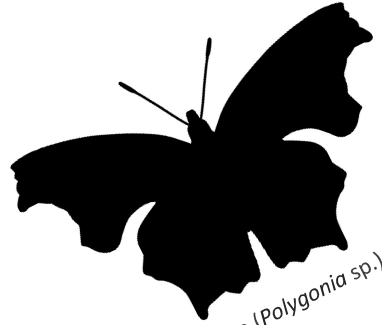
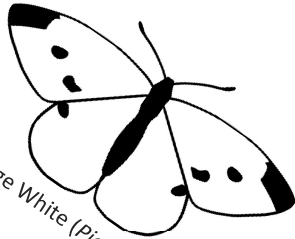




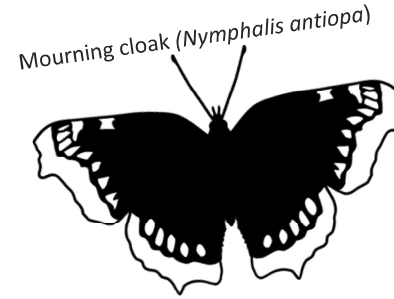

Comma (*Polygonia* sp.)



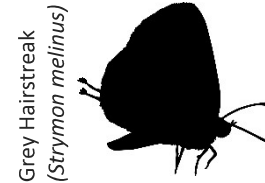
Cabbage White (*Pieris rapae*)

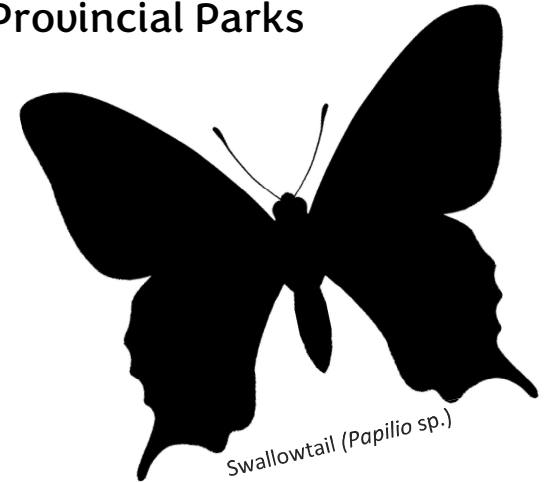
